From the Pastor's Desk

Extended Advent

Grace and peace to you!

This year, Christmas Eve falls on a Sunday. Whenever this occurs, the church year calendar stipulates that the fourth Sunday in Advent is celebrated in the morning, and Christmas Eve is celebrated in the evening.

Advent is my favorite season of the liturgical year, and I was disappointed when I realized that this year's Advent season would last only 21 days. This gave me an idea: what if we started Advent one week earlier this year? Given these anxious times we are living in, a season of hopeful waiting and expectation is worth celebrating for as long as possible.

In October, our worship committee met and decided that we would shift the liturgical calendar ahead one week, celebrate Christ the King Sunday on November 19 and the first Sunday of Advent on November 26. In addition, we decided to forego a morning service on December 24. The biggest change is that our Christmas Eve service will be at 1:30 in the afternoon, with our annual Christmas music festival beginning at 1:00 pm.

I admit that I felt sad about decision *not* to worship on Christmas Eve evening. This may be the first Christmas Eve during my lifetime that I will not be in church in the nighttime. And yet, our Christmas Eve attendance has been on a sharp decline over the last several years.


On the other hand, in 2021 and 2022 I led afternoon Christmas Eve services at Bethesda in Lower Burrell, and their attendance was quite strong. Families with small children were happy that they would not have to keep their children out late in the evening, while persons who are unable to drive at night were excited that they could finally worship on Christmas Eve. If it snows on Christmas Eve, road conditions are generally better during the daytime than at night. With all these factors in mind, we felt this year would be a great year to try something new and different.

But most of the elements of Christmas Eve that we all love and treasure will stay the same. Our musicians are working hard to enrich our worship with uplifting and beautiful songs. We will sing Silent Night in candlelight. Most importantly, we will be together.

Remember, we are celebrating the birth of Jesus Christ, who is always bringing doing new things and opening doors to new opportunities for us to grow in faith and make a difference in the world.





